INTRODUCTION

It's time to set sail on Disney Cruise Line's newest ship – the **Disney Treasure**! The Treasure had its christening in New York City on November 19th, 2024 and made its maiden voyage on December 21st, 2024.

The ship is now in its “**inaugural season**,” offering seven-night sailings to the Eastern and Western Caribbean from Port Canaveral – including stops at Disney's Castaway Cay. This itinerary will continue through at least May of 2026.

The design of the Disney Treasure **draws influences from Asia, Africa, and even Aladdin's Agrabah.**

But it's not just Aladdin and Jasmine joining you on this adventure. The Disney Treasure also explores the realms of other popular Disney stories including **Coco, Zootopia, Moana, Star Wars**, and many more.

RESTAURANTS OVERVIEW

The Disney Treasure has a LOT to experience when it comes to dining!

There are three restaurants that are part of **Disney Cruise Line's signature Rotational Dining**, whereby you get to enjoy dinner at each of these unique spots while the wonderful servers rotate with you so they get to know your group and dining preferences.

Since the Treasure's itineraries are a week long, you'll get multiple experiences at certain restaurants (so you'll notice that some restaurants offer different shows each night to make your experience unique).

The rotational dining restaurant options include a Coco-themed spot (with music and more), Worlds of Marvel (featuring an Avengers mission), and 1923 (a journey through animation).

But that's not all! Aboard the Treasure you'll also find a Haunted Mansion-themed lounge, a Jungle Cruise-themed lounge, a pub inspired by 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea, and a lounge themed to The Aristocats.

Plus, there are some more casual dining spots, like a food hall and sweets shop. AND there are some adults-only restaurants too.

Let's get into the details now.



Restaurants - Rotational Dining

PLAZA DE COCO

Let's start with a NEW restaurant that is entirely unique to the Disney Treasure – **Plaza de Coco!** This is a theatrical dining experience and the first-ever Disney Cruise Line restaurant to be themed around the beloved Disney Pixar film.

The restaurant actually offers 2 different shows. Night 1 is focused on a festive gathering of familia (with the Riviera family). Night 2 is a celebration of Dia de los Muertos (Miguel will reunite with his great-grandparents thanks to his magical guitar).

Each show is presented in a theatre-in-the-round environment with a central stage.

There are 2 different dinner menus inspired by each experience. The menus take inspiration from Miguel's colorful world and feature Mexican eats with a modern twist. Some dishes you might get to try include chorizo croquettes, shrimp diablo, pollo asado, grilled snapper, port wine braised center cut beef short rib, coconut tres leches, margarita lime cheesecake, and a Mexican chocolate tart.

And if it's a drink you're after, look for themed cocktails, traditional drinks, wines, and more.

Be sure to look for the Ofrenda, which is decorated with beautiful flowers and photos.



WORLDS OF MARVEL

On the Treasure, you also have the chance to experience **Worlds of Marvel**, a dinner experience where you'll play a role in an action-packed Avengers mission. There are TONS of monitors throughout the restaurant so you won't miss a thing.

Your two nights here feature their own individual shows and dinner menus. One of the shows is Avengers: Quantum Encounter (also on the Disney Wish ship). That show features Ant-Man and The Wasp in a quest to defeat an "infamous foe" (we won't ruin too much of the story!).

Unique to the Treasure is the NEW Guardians of the Galaxy-themed show (Marvel Celebration of Heroes: Groot Remix). Groot will bring you along for a quest to throw a surprise party for Rocket Raccoon. You'll listen to an "awesome mix" of songs and test your Marvel knowledge with trivia questions throughout dinner.

The food is inspired by places in the Marvel Cinematic Universe, like Wakanda, Sokovia, and more. Some dishes you might see include salmon, beef wellington, and more. Look for souvenir sippers too like the Pym Particle Enlarged Coke Can sipper.



Restaurants - Rotational Dining

1923

The last rotational dining restaurant is **1923**, which presents an upscale Hollywood setting with “a dash of Disney whimsy,” featuring fresh California flavors on the menu. This restaurant is on the Treasure and Wish ships.

It pays homage to the founders of the Walt Disney Company - so you'll either dine in the Walt Disney or Roy Disney dining room.

Throughout the space, look for props, drawings, animation tools, and more - all meant to show you the evolution of Disney animation over the last century.

You'll find displays featuring artwork and more from various Disney movies like Up, The Lion King, Tarzan, Aladdin, and more. The space definitely has an elegant feel to it and is more quiet than the entertainment-filled Worlds of Marvel and Plaza de Coco restaurants.

The menu is inspired by the cultural flavors found throughout California - blending Asian, European, and South American influences.

And look for various wines (among other drinks) offered, including some from California's Napa Valley.





Restaurants - Lounges

If you're a diehard Disney Parks fan who hasn't previously considered a Disney Cruise...well, you may be tempted to book a cruise after learning about some of the themes of the **NEW lounges on the Disney Treasure!**

SKIPPER SOCIETY

Let's start with Skipper Society – a lounge themed after the World Famous Jungle Cruise ride and its hilarious Skippers.

You'll find puns and nods to the ride in this space. Look for 2 oars with the numbers 55 and 71 – nods to the years Disneyland and Magic Kingdom opened. There's also lush greenery and awnings that look like Jungle Cruise boats.

There are a handful of cocktails on the menu (including the Hippopotomai-Tai some may recognize from Trader Sam's), jungle juice (a.k.a. the fan-favorite POG juice - passion orange guava), wine, beer, and more. Check out the Skipper Sipper – served in a souvenir boat mug.

Plus, you'll find a signature waffle treat here.

Listen closely and you might hear Disney Parks music (including spiels from the Jungle Cruise ride). Oh and you'll get to enjoy live music too – there's plenty to check out here!





Restaurants - Lounges

HAUNTED MANSION PARLOR

Calling all happy haunts! Stop by this spooky space to enjoy a HAUNTED MANSION-themed lounge.

This spot is focused on the story of a captain who entered the realm of the ghosts after a “disastrous dinner with his beloved fiancée.” The space is heavily themed, so you’ll feel like you’ve stepped right into the ride.

Look for details like a ghostly aquarium with a skeleton fish, the Donald Duck chair, and various illusions.

There are some exclusive tiki mugs available here, as well as other unique souvenirs.

Menu options include custom sodas (like Grim Grinning Grape or Screaming Soda), Sympathetic Libations (a zero-proof cocktail), the Ghoulish Delight (an ube-flavored option), a tequila-based cocktail with a secret message, wine, beer, and more.

And if you solve a riddle on the tablet menu, you can unlock a HIDDEN cocktail served in an incredible gargoyle receptacle (for 2). Basically, this spot is a spooky nightmare come true!





Restaurants - Lounges

THE PERISCOPE PUB

Welcome to a lounge inspired by the 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea film and the Disney Parks attraction that was themed to it.

This features a submarine-inspired setting with some 19th century steampunk influences.

Be sure to look closely at those mysterious windows to the “outside” as you never know what creatures may be lurking around.

Look for all kinds of theming here - down to the tap handles at the bar!

This spot is your connection to what’s happening on land, as it features news and live sports on “scientific” monitors.

Some of the menu options here include cocktails, mead, wines, beer, options on tap, beer specials, and nonalcoholic options.

Want something exclusive? Check out the 3 exclusive tap beers themed to 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea (the movie and the ride it inspired).

Plus, you’ll find some snacks like wings and other options.





Restaurants - Lounges

SCAT CAT LOUNGE

Our final lounge is one themed to The Aristocats movie! This is a jazz club-style venue with specific inspiration coming from the film's "Ev'rybody Wants to be a Cat" sequence.

Step inside and you'll find a massive black-and-white statement wall (reminiscent of piano keys) that extends through the center of the lounge.

Look for colorful paw marks on the lounge's piano too (a reference to the scene where Toulouse leaves similar prints on a piano).

A poster hanging nearby features cats playing instruments - those are inspired by pets belonging to folks that helped design this space.

The menu has drinks themed to the movie - like The Crème de la Crème Martini, The Cat Drink, and The Turkish Tea Experience. One pricey drink experience comes with an impressive (though a bit terrifying) cat-themed souvenir cup!

If you're after a luxurious champagne or drink experience, you'd be hard-pressed to find a better spot than Scat Cat Lounge on the Disney Treasure.



Restaurants - Casual Dining

MARCELINE MARKET

Marceline Market is a food hall (which you'll also find on the Disney Wish cruise ship) named after Marceline, Missouri – where Walt Disney's childhood home is.

This spot has different food stations ("markets") inspired by marketplaces around the world.

You'll find classic favorites, plant-based offerings, international specialties, and more for breakfast and lunch.

While enjoying the constantly-changing food offerings, you'll be able to take in ocean views from the tables inside or step to the outside seating area.

There is a lot of seating, but dining areas like this can fill up so you'll want to plan accordingly (and go early if you're trying to sit with a large group).

You'll find drink dispensers here with basic sodas, water, and more, so it's a good place to load up on your drinks and get refreshed.



Restaurants - Casual Dining

MICKEY & FRIENDS FESTIVAL OF FOODS

If you're looking for another casual dining option, head to the upper decks for Mickey & Friends Festival of Foods (also appears on the Disney Wish ship).

This is an open-air eatery that is inspired by the seaside boardwalk you see in The Wonderful World of Mickey Mouse shorts.

Here, you'll find character-inspired food stations that will generally serve up quick bites like pizza, soft-serve ice cream, burgers, tacos, BBQ, and more.

This includes spots like Mickey's Smokestack Barbecue, Daisy's Pizza Pies, Goofy's Grill, Minnie's Delights, and Donald's Cantina.

These are generally available throughout the day and well into the evening.

Look for shaded seating nearby so you can enjoy your food.





Restaurants - Cafes & Sweet Shops

JUMBEAUX'S SWEETS

Jumbeaux's Sweets is a premium sweets spot inspired by Jerry Jumbeaux Jr. (and the ice cream parlor, Jumbeaux's Café) from Zootopia.

There are some fun details to enjoy here, like the sculpture of Officer Judy Hopps and Nick Wilde.

The shop itself has a LOT of playful pink colors and Victorian-style architecture.

On the menu you'll find more than 20(!) flavors of handmade gelato, 16 flavors of ice cream and sorbets, milshakes, candies, macarons, brownies, and other specialty sweets (like a paw shortbread sandwich, leopard mango cakesicle, chocolate-covered strawberries, and chocolate bark post cards).

If you want to go ALL OUT, you can grab a treat with a souvenir ice cream truck.

Keep in mind this is a premium spot so the treats here are not included in the price of your cruise and will cost you extra!





Restaurants - Cafes & Sweet Shops

HEIHEI CAFE

Moana's sidekick is the inspiration for Heihei Cafe – a casual walk-up cafe just off the Grand Hall.

There's a blue water vibe here (makes sense!) and the style of the furniture actually pays homage to a traditional technique of construction used by the Polynesian people to make vessels that sail the seas.

You'll find a statue of the hilarious chicken at the cafe so be sure to look for him!

There are spots to sit here and even some purse hooks and outlets to charge your phone – so convenient!

The menu consists of the usual coffee and lattes you might find at other coffee shops on Disney ships. It's a nice place to stop for a quick bit of caffeine and a treat!





Restaurants - Cafes & Sweet Shops

JADE CRICKET CAFE

Another walk-up cafe on the ship is Jade Cricket Cafe - inspired by the Fa Family's "lucky" cricket, Cri-Kee from Mulan.

Keep your eyes open for a jade sculpture on the bar top that is a tribute to Cri-Kee.

You'll spot a central moon gate and plum blossom flowers too, which serve as symbols of Mulan's heritage, as well as her strength and beauty.

Oh and look at those counters - they are kind-of reminiscent of Mulan's armor!

Grab a seat in one of the soft chairs and you'll get to enjoy a menu with coffee, tea, specialty drinks, and more.



Restaurants - Cafes & Sweet Shops

COVE CAFE

Cove Cafe is located in the Quiet Cove area and is an adults-only poolside lounge. It's inspired by Moana and features gourmet coffee, tea options, specialty drinks, pastries, and treats too.

WHEEZY'S FREEZIES

This spot is inspired by Wheezy – the penguin from Toy Story 2. It's a poolside spot that offers up frozen-fruit smoothies that'll help you cool down throughout the day!





Restaurants - Adult-Exclusive Dining

THE ROSE

There are 3 adult-exclusive dining experiences on the Treasure, all inspired by Beauty and the Beast.

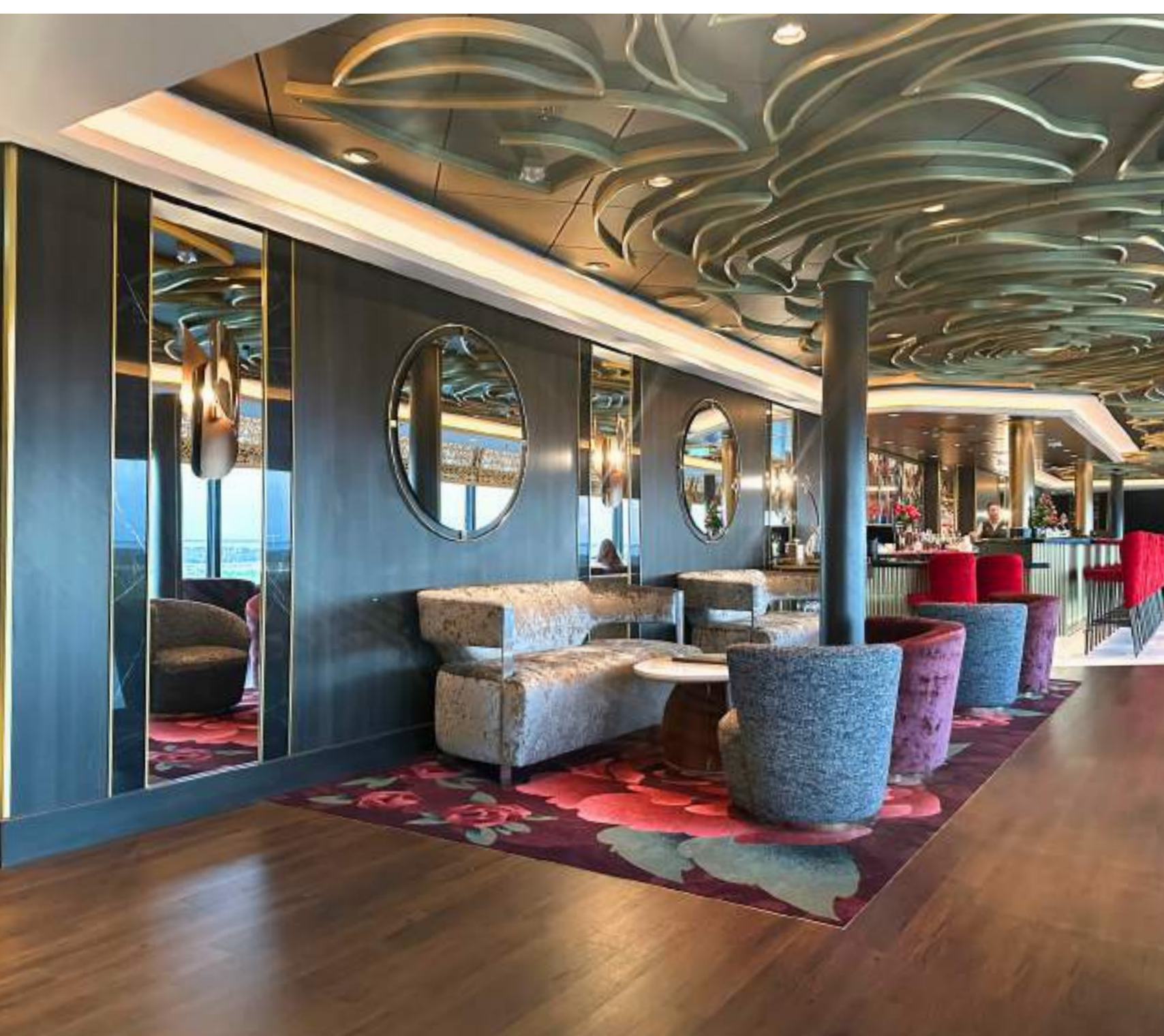
Let's start off with The Rose – a lounge where you can enjoy a before or after-dinner cocktail or pick from various wines and liquors.

This spot is not exclusive to the Treasure, as it also appears on the Disney Wish.

It's located at the entrance to the other 2 adult-exclusive restaurants (Palo Steakhouse and Enchanté) and has some beautiful details inspired by the popular film.

Look for the famous rose from the movie (of course), artwork commissioned for the ship, a golden rotunda, and plush seating and beautiful views.

On the menu you'll find high-end wines and liquors, and a special menu of small plates.





Restaurants - Adult-Exclusive Dining

PALO STEAKHOUSE

Palo Steakhouse is inspired by Cogsworth, the clock from *Beauty and the Beast*.

Aside from the spectacular views, you'll also find details that are meant to remind you of gears and other pieces of a clock.

This is another restaurant that appears on both the Disney Treasure and Disney Wish cruise ships.

Here, you'll find a mix of Italian dishes and steaks (from Kobe to wagyu and everything in between).

You'll also find Italian wines, craft beers, the signature Palo chocolate souffle dessert (made fresh to order!), and more.

If you want a little bit of a different experience in this space, you can opt for brunch (instead of dinner).

Note that this is an elegant affair and you're expected to dress the part (formal or semi-formal attire is recommended, but dress-casual attire with a "polished look" is acceptable). Brunch has slightly different rules with dress shorts being accepted.





Restaurants - Adult-Exclusive Dining

ENCHANTÉ

The final restaurant in this adult-exclusive trio is Enchanté, inspired by Lumière (the candlestick from Beauty and the Beast).

This is (again) a restaurant that is on both the Disney Wish and Disney Treasure.

It is the most elegant dining experience on the Treasure, and features a gourmet menu created by three-Michelin-starred Chef Arnaud Lallement.

The menu offers ingredients and dishes from around the world.

In addition to dinner, you can visit for a prix-fixe or a la carte lunch.

Be sure to look for nods to Beauty and the Beast throughout the space, including lots of candlelight, metallic elements, and more.

This is a fancy spot so you'll want to dress the part. Formal or semi-formal attire is recommended, but dress-casual attire with a "polished look" is acceptable too.





STATEROOMS



The Disney Treasure offers 1,256 staterooms, with custom artwork and design elements featuring nods to Disney and Pixar films including *Aladdin*, *Pocahontas*, *Up*, and *Encanto*!

Designed with families in mind, **many of the staterooms have Disney Cruise Line's signature split-bath concept** (GENIUS!), and many also offer the option for a connecting door for adjoining staterooms (451 connecting doors total!).



Most of the ship's staterooms feature an ocean view, with 877 of the 1,256 staterooms boasting a verandah.

Passengers sailing in Concierge-level staterooms can access an exclusive concierge lounge with a private sun deck. **Concierge-level suites present design elements "inspired by the majestic grasslands Simba calls home" in *The Lion King*.**

Staterooms - Suites

ROYAL SUITES

The Four Royal Suites are **spaces that "bring to life the incredible character journeys - and some beloved feline sidekicks"** from the films *The Lion King*, *The Jungle Book*, and *Aladdin*.

These spots include the **Bagheera Royal Suites**. (Yes, Bagheera, the panther from *The Jungle Book*.) They also include the **Rajah Royal Suites** themed to Princess Jasmine's loyal tiger from *Aladdin*.

You can typically choose from a 1-story royal suite or 2-story royal suite.

Royal Suites generally feature:

- 2 main bedrooms
- 3 full bathrooms
- Private balcony with a whirlpool tub
- Large living area
- Open dining salon
- Pantry and wet bar stocked with water and sodas
- Walk-in closet in both main bedrooms



TOMORROW TOWER SUITE

Are you ready for the ultimate indulgence? The Tomorrow Tower Suite is an EPCOT-inspired suite (it is inspired by EPCOT's World Discovery neighborhood).

There are all kinds of futuristic details and nods to EPCOT (like a Spaceship Earth-inspired light!)

Located "high in the ship's forward funnel," this suite overlooks the top deck of the ship and has stunning views from its two-story window.

This suite has a LOT:

- Nearly 2,000 square feet of living space
- Room to sleep up to 8 people
- Living room
- Kitchen area
- Bar
- 2 main bedrooms
- A library/bedroom
- A children's room (with bunk beds)
- 4.5 bathrooms
- A walk-in closet
- 5 LCD flat-screen TVs
- A PILLOW menu(!)
- A Figment detail on the ceiling
- And MORE!



ENTERTAINMENT



As with all Disney Cruise Line ships, there is a LOT of entertainment when it comes to the Disney Treasure. Let's break it down!

On every Disney Cruise Line ship, the **Walt Disney Theatre** is home to Broadway-style shows developed exclusively for Disney Cruise Line.

On the Disney Treasure, the featured productions are some fan favorites: *Beauty and the Beast* and *Disney Seas the Adventure* (an original production with Disney songs).

But there is also a NEW & exclusive show: *Disney The Tale of Moana!* This is the first time Disney brings Moana's story to the stage.

You'll follow the story of the film with the spirit of Gramma Tala as the narrator. Watch for beloved characters, like Maui. And get ready to hear some of the super popular songs from the film.

This show has it all - a set design inspired by the Pacific Islands, projections, puppetry, a NEW song written for the show, and more.



You can find classic Disney Cruise Line activities – including character encounters, musical performances, and shows – in the **Grand Hall**.

First-run movies are shown in the **Wonderland** and **Never Land Cinemas**.

Enjoy daytime activities – like game shows – in **Sarabi** (themed to the natural beauty of the savanna – and named after the lioness matriarch from *The Lion King*). The space then becomes a hub for adults-only entertainment in the evenings.



Get your game on in **Hero Zone** – a sports & recreation space made for active family time. Get ready to complete physical challenges and game show-style competitions!

At **Triton Lounge**, you can enjoy drinks along with fun activities, like family karaoke and trivia.

And you CAN'T miss the **Pirate's Rockin' Parlay Party** and **fireworks at sea!**



There's a lot to enjoy that's water-focused too (as you might expect on a cruise). The Disney Treasure features an attraction at sea called the **AquaMouse** (which first debuted on the Disney Wish). Unique to the Treasure is the **Curse of the Golden Egg** story in the AquaMouse.

You'll get to go into the world of the animated Mickey Mouse shorts in this water ride that takes two riders at a time 760 feet around the upper deck. And the ride even takes you sailing OVER the side of the ship in a completely clear tube for some unbelievable views!



Little kiddos can check out the **Toy Story-themed splash zone** for some fun that can help you cool down.

And you'll find a total of **10 pools** to help you beat the heat, plus water play areas that are inspired by Mickey and his friends.

Adults can head to **Quiet Cove** for an infinity pool, poolside bar, cafe, and space to relax.

RELAXATION, FITNESS, & PAMPERING



If it's relaxation you're after, you may want to head to **Senses Spa**.

There, you can enjoy a variety of spa and beauty treatments. There are private treatment rooms, spa villas, steam and aromatherapy rooms, and more.

Those wanting to exercise can head to **Senses Fitness**.

For more pampering, head to **Hook's Barbery** for a twist on a European men's salon (inspired by Captain Hook). Get a shave, cut, nail care, and skincare here. OH and check out the HIDDEN BAR!

The **Untangled Salon** is inspired by Tangled and offers haircuts, manicures, hair styling, pedicures, teeth whitening, and skin treatments so you can REALLY kick back and relax.

At **Bibbidi Bobbidi Boutique at Sea**, kids can be transformed into princesses, knights, pirates, or even Captain Minnie!





KIDS & TEENS CLUBS



Disney offers up plenty of spaces for its younger voyagers too (in fact, the adults might be VERY jealous of just how incredibly detailed and fun these spots are!). Here's what kiddos and teens can enjoy on the Treasure.

DISNEY'S OCEANEER CLUB (AGES 3-10)

Kids get to explore the Oceaneer Club with the help of Disney-trained counselors. There are a few different areas:



First, there's the **Marvel Super Hero Academy**, where kids train to be the next generation of superheroes by learning the ropes from friends like Spider-Man, Black Panther, Ant-Man, and the Wasp.



You also have **Fairytale Hall** – a group of activity rooms themed to honor some iconic Disney ladies (who may just happen to stop by...) – featuring Rapunzel's Art Studio (for arts & crafts), Belle's Library (with the chance to read and act out stories), and more.



In **Star Wars: Cargo Bay**, kids take on the role of creature handlers and help “take care” of Star Wars creatures (think porgs, Loth-cats, and worrts... OH, MY!)

The Oceaneer Club also has the **Walt Disney Imagineering Lab**, where kids “discover the secrets of world-renowned Disney Imagineers” through hands-on activities and experiments.

And there’s also **Mickey and Minnie Captain’s Deck** – a nautical-themed playground filled with sensory games and activities. You’ll find a slide, a ship’s wheel, busy boxes, and you might even get a surprise visit from Captain Minnie Mouse!



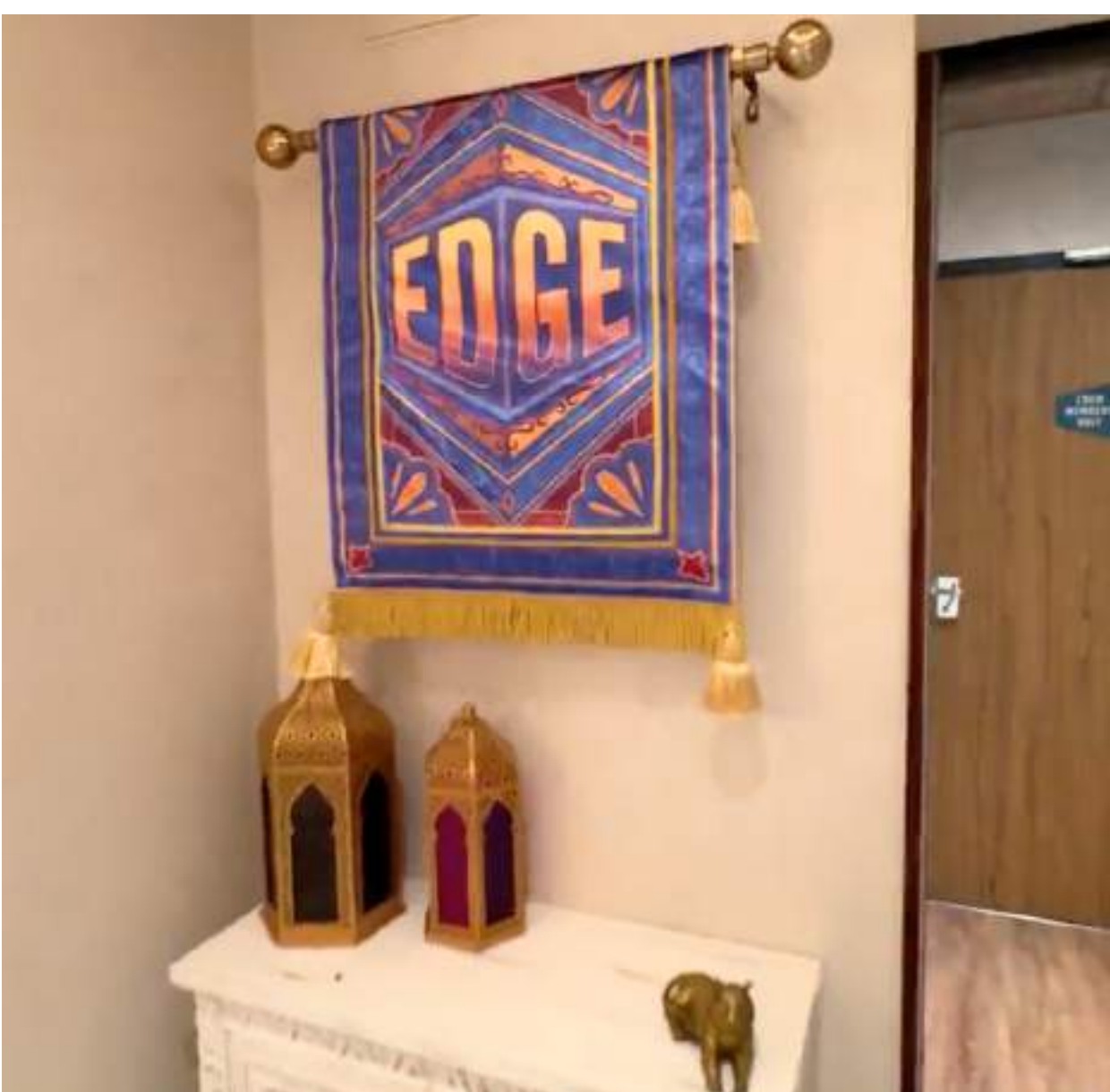


EDGE, VIBE, AND THE HIDEAWAY

The stylish **Vibe** is a hangout for teenagers (ages 14-17). While there, the teens can watch TV, listen to some tunes, play games, and relax. The theme of the lounge is a Parisian-style loft with an “electric retro twist.”

The New York City loft-inspired **Edge** is for tweens (ages 11-14). This has windows overlooking the ocean and tons of selfie-opportunities along with other experiences for tweens to enjoy.

Older teens and young adults can hang out at **The Hideaway**—where karaoke contests and dance competitions are all-the-rage.



“IT’S A SMALL WORLD” NURSERY!

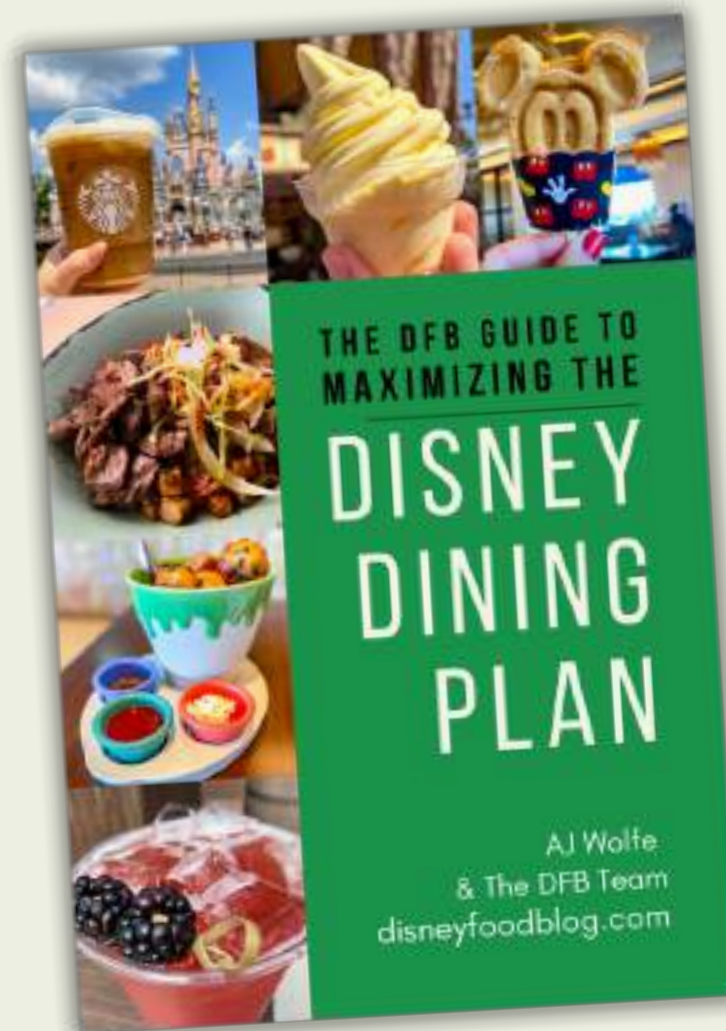
